Introduction

AI Assisted sermons are a great way to help congregations better understand the teachings of Christ. The **Sermon Writer Assistant** uses this technology and some other programs to simplify the steps necessary to use AI. We charge a modest fee for this program which we feel is easily justified by offering you a complete licensed system without the additional complexities required of you having to go to many sources to obtain and pay for the necessary license keys required by the Open AI programs.

AI technology can be used to analyze the text of a sermon, identify key themes and topics, and help the preacher better communicate these messages to their audience.

Additionally, AI can be used to suggest relevant Bible verses and passages, helping to provide deeper insights into the sermon's subject. By using AI to assist with the sermon, preachers can better engage their congregation and help them gain a deeper understanding of the teachings of Christ.

Getting Started

Sermon Writer Assistant may be obtained by downloading the software on this page:

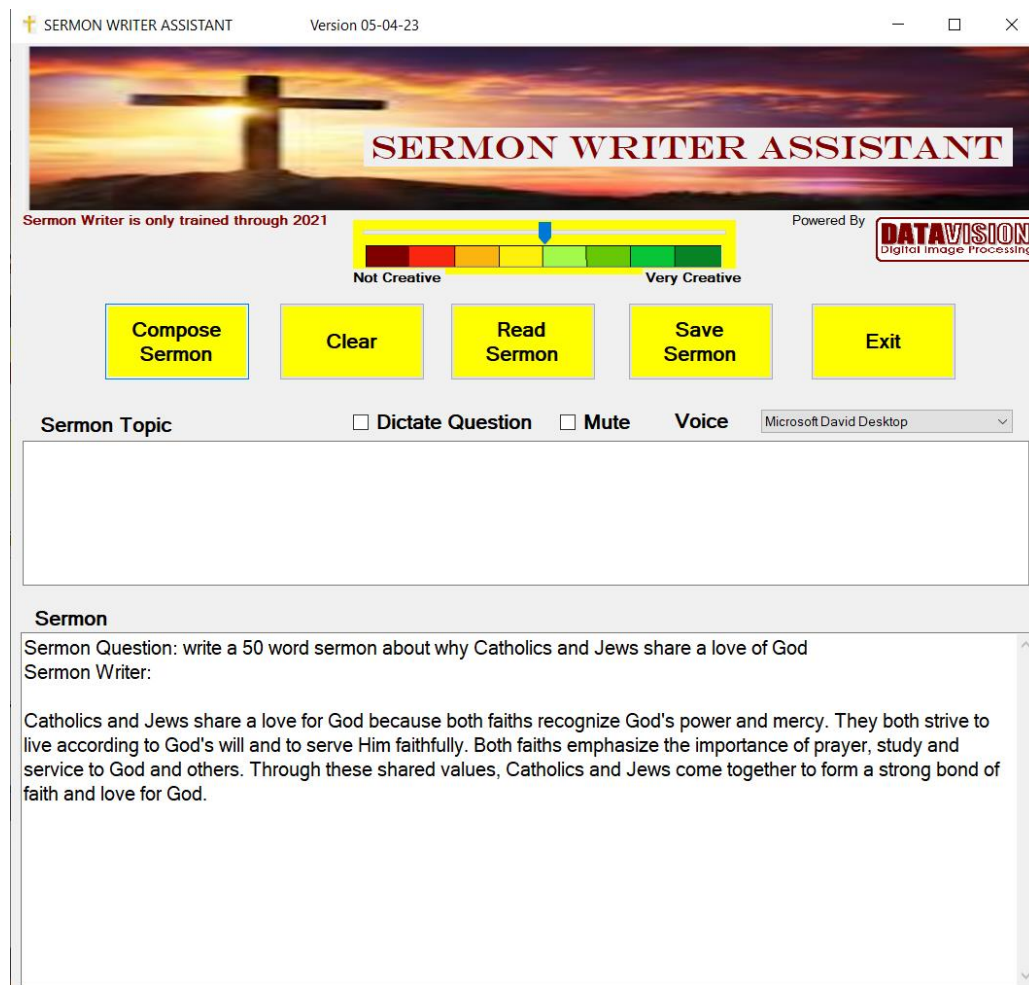

The software includes a five day free trial. During this free test period you may compose as many Sunday Sermons, Marriage Sermons, Bible Class Outlines, etc. as want. At the end of five days the software requires a license, which can be obtained from DATAVISION IMAGE LLC for \$100.00.

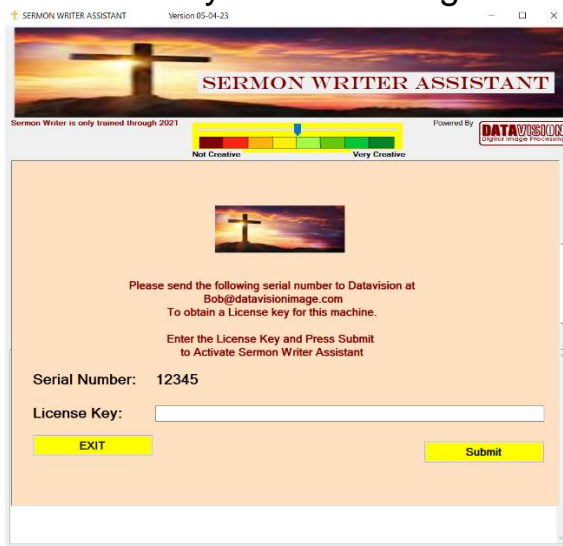
Here is what the product looks like when you first start it:



The product costs \$100.00 which provides you with a fully paid license to make as many sermons as you want. DATAVISION has a contract with Open AI, to license the technology used by this product.

Chat GPT is changing, and new features are constantly being developed. When you purchase the Sermon Writer Assistant, your purchase includes 90 day phone and email support. At the end of this period you may elect to continue support for an additional \$49.95 per year. We will notify you of this option.

After five days the following screen will appear:



Simply email the Serial Number to us, and we will send you a License Key by return email. Once you type in the correct License Key, the software will run as normal. You only need to do this once.

Features

The Sermon Writer Assistant has several buttons to help you compose a sermon, speech, or lesson plan. Let's look at each of the controls.

The first thing you notice is the product has a "Creativity Slide".

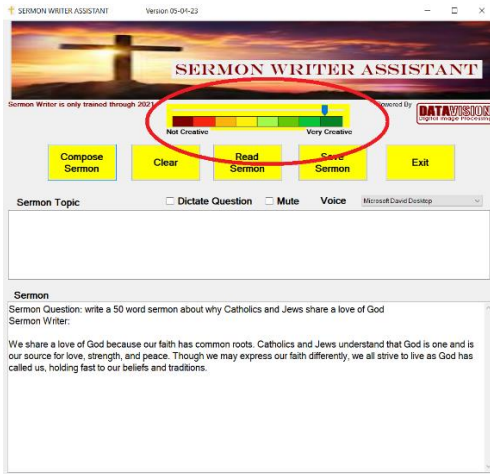


Figure 1. Creativity Slide

The software will compose Sermons and other texts depending on what and how you ask the software to do. The “Creativity Slide” is set to allow the software to be more or less creative when composing a document for you. If you set the slide to “0” on the far left the software will compose the answer to your input question in a very simple way (Not Creative). Multiple questions on the same subject will cause the software to return similar answers. If you set the slide more to the right the answers will vary from similar inquiries and will be “More Creative”. We recommend you set this control to the center position to start.

The next set of controls are the command buttons:

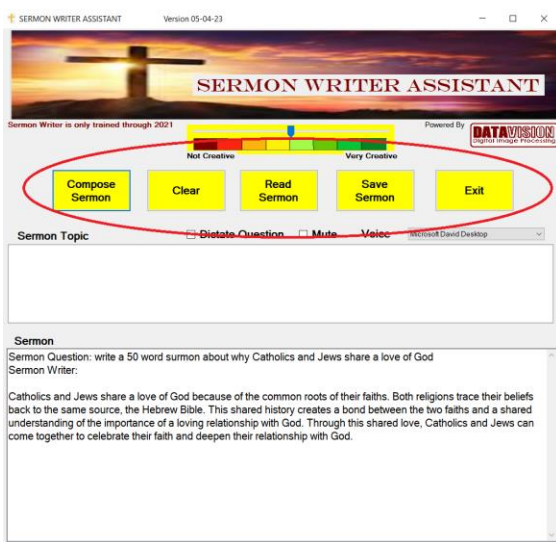


Figure 2. Buttons

Notice there are five buttons:

1. **Compose Sermon**
2. **CLEAR**
3. **Read Sermon**
4. **Save Sermon**
5. **EXIT**

To begin you should type in the Sermon Topic Text Box. Later we will explain how to get really good results from the software, but for now, the Sermon Topic is typed into the top box shown below:

Once you have entered in a description of what you want the Sermon Writer Assistant to do, just press “**Compose Sermon**”. The software will pause for 2-3 seconds and then return an answer in the “Sermon”

box below.

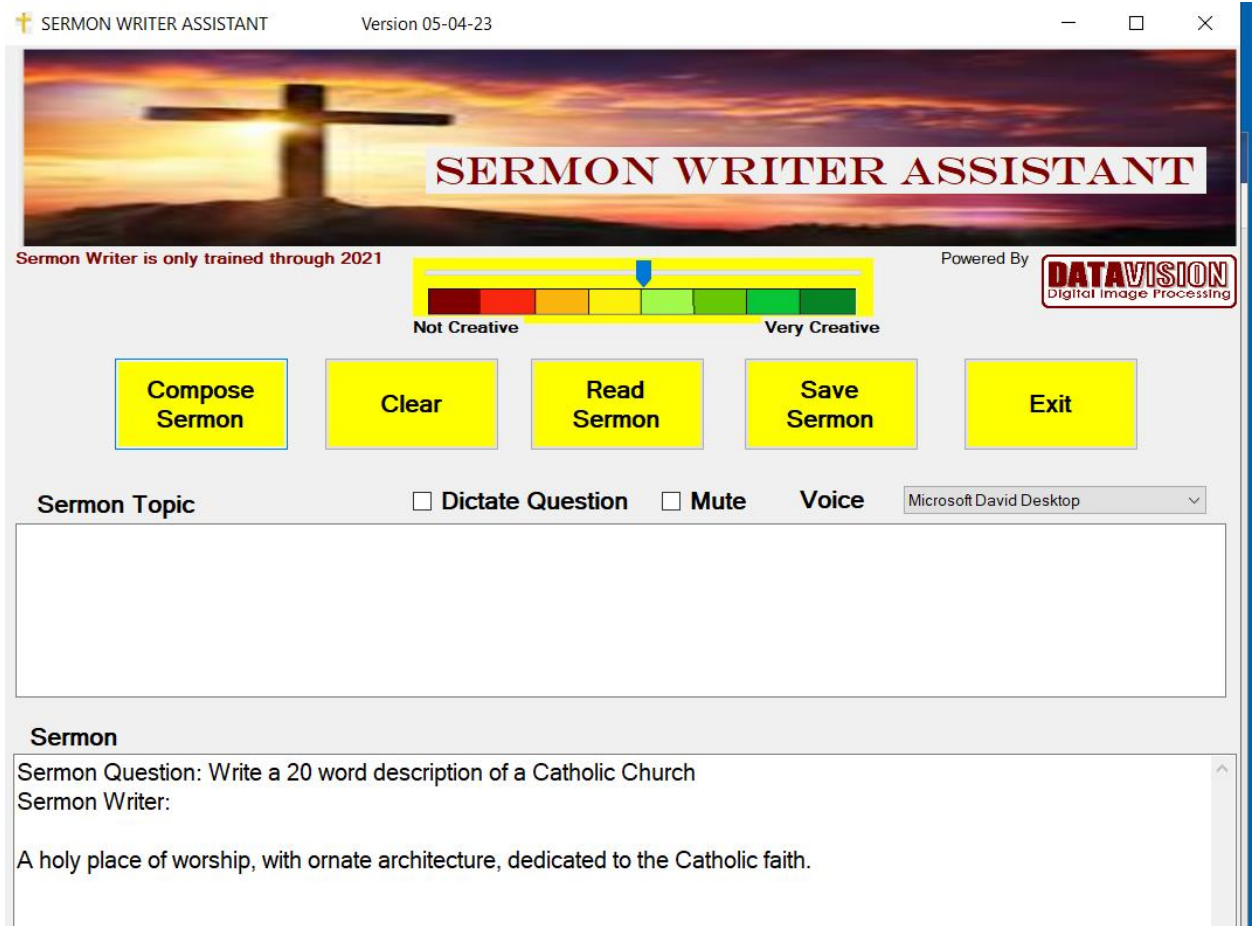


Figure 4. Sermon Composed

The next button is the “**Clear**” button which will clear all text boxes. Don’t push this button if you want to save the results or hear what your new sermon sounds like.

The next button is the “**Read Sermon**” button. This is a very handy button and works in conjunction with the “Voice” control. The software has an artificial Male and an artificial Female voice. Select which one you want to use and press “**Read Sermon**”. Sit back and listen to want your new sermon sounds like. You can save it and edit it manually if you want.

The next button is the “**Save Sermon**” button. When this is pressed the software will bring up a selection of places to which you may want to save your new Sermon. This is what it looks like:

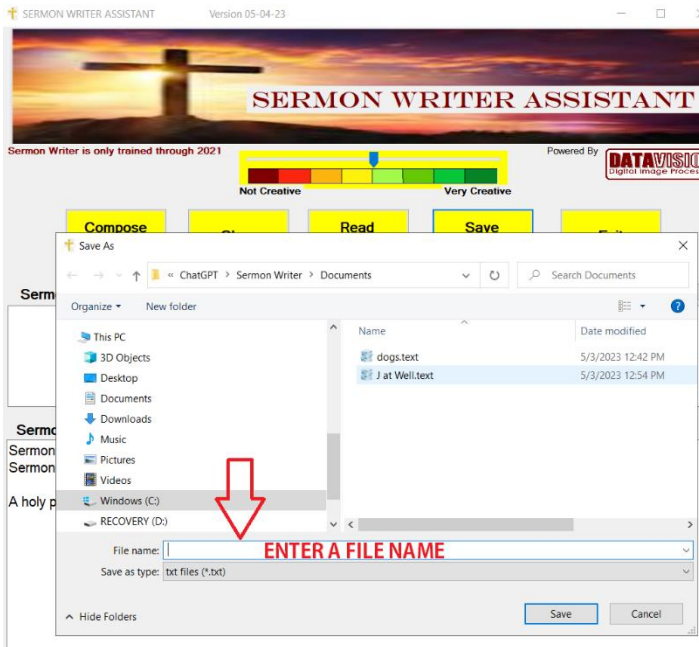


Figure 5. Saving the Sermon

The last button is called “EXIT” and it will close the application.

Other Controls

Notice there are a few more controls, which are not used too often.

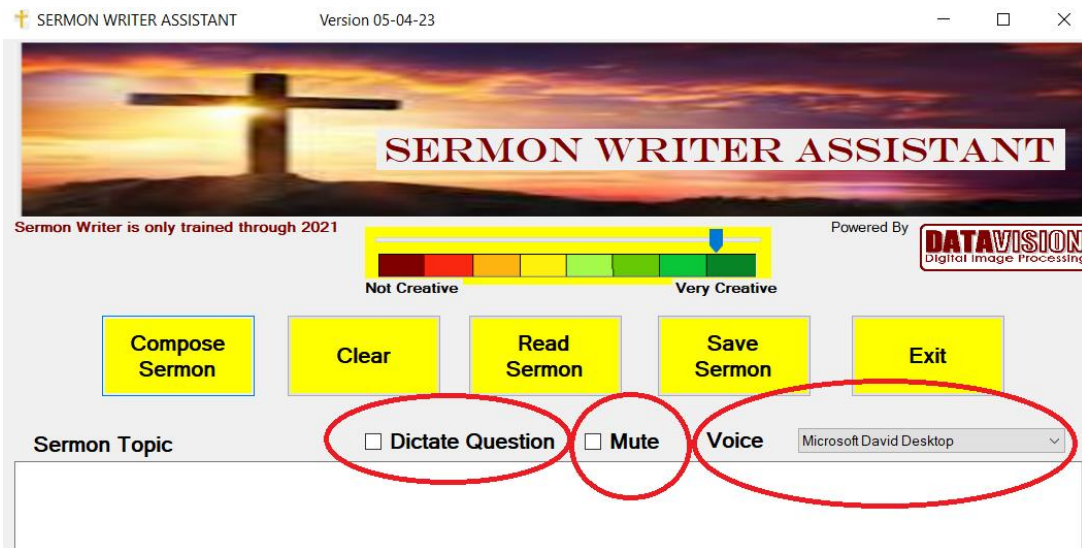


Figure 6. Other Controls

1. Dictate
2. Mute
3. Voice

These controls allow special functions to occur. Let us look at each control:

The “**Dictate**” button will allow you to just speak to the software. As you speak the words will show up in the “Sermon Topic” box. Once you have dictated your request, press the “**Compose Sermon**” button and your sermon will be prepared. ***Please note the Dictate control can easily get confused so speak slowly and clearly.***

The next button is the “**Mute**” button which stops the voice playback.

The third control is the “**Voice**” control. You may select a male or female voice to read back your sermon.

Using the product

Once you practice a short time you will be composing very good sermons and other speeches. The Sermon Writer Assistant is trained on the bible so it can pick out references for you even if you do not have the reference. For example we asked the product to write a short sermon regarding when Jesus met the Samaritan woman at the well in John’s gospel. Here is a typical result:

Sermon Question: Write a 100 word sermon about Jesus at the well

Sermon Writer:

Jesus is a great example to us in many ways, but one of the most important lessons we can learn from him is the power of compassion. Jesus showed us this when he visited the well in Samaria.

The woman at the well was an outcast in her society, and yet Jesus showed her compassion by engaging her in conversation. He spoke with her openly, without judgement. He showed her understanding and kindness, and in turn she was moved to share her story with him.

Jesus’ compassion and understanding of the woman at the well was an example of how we should treat others. We should show compassion regardless of who they are or what their circumstances are. We should be understanding and kind, and be willing to listen to their stories.

By showing compassion and understanding, we can make a real difference in the lives of those around us. Just like Jesus did at the well.

You can add a reference if you want, and it will help. Here is an example:

Sermon Question: write a 100 word sermon about Christ's love using first letter of Paul to the Corinthians (12:31-13:8)

Sermon Writer:

Paul reminds us that Christ's love is the greatest of all gifts. It is patient and kind, never jealous or boastful, and it does not dishonor others. It is not easily angered, and it keeps no record of wrongs. Christ's love is always faithful and hopeful, and it endures through every circumstance. It is a love that never fails.

We should strive to emulate this same love. We should be patient and kind, not envious or proud. We should honor others and not be easily angered. We should forgive and forget, and remain faithful and hopeful in all things.

Let us remember that Christ's love is the greatest of all gifts. He gave us the ultimate sacrifice, and it is our duty to show the same love to our fellow man. Let us be a reflection of Christ's love in our everyday lives.

Some Tips About Using Sermon Writer Assistant

1. Use clear and concise language when conversing with **Sermon Writer Assistant**. Avoid using slang or jargon as **Sermon Writer Assistant** may not understand.
2. Sermons take about one minute to read 140 words. To compose a five minute sermon, multiply $140 \times 5 = 700$ words. Ask **Sermon Writer Assistant** to write a 700 word sermon about XXX to obtain a sermon that will take five minutes to deliver.
3. Ask open ended questions to get the best response from **Sermon Writer Assistant**. The following is an open ended question:

What do you think is the most important lesson that Jesus taught us?

4. Avoid using too many commands or commands that are too complex.

5. Provide **Sermon Writer Assistant** with context to help it understand the conversation. The following is an example of context: ***What are the best strategies for managing a remote team [in order to maximize productivity?](#)***
6. Be patient with **Sermon Writer Assistant** and give it time to process and respond to your requests.
7. Give **Sermon Writer Assistant** plenty of information to work with and provide it with additional data as needed. For example here is a statement with additional data: ***Write a 100 word sermon about Christ's love using first letter of Paul to the Corinthians (12:31-13:8)***
8. Ask follow up questions to help **Sermon Writer Assistant** understand the conversation better.
9. Avoid asking too many questions at once as **Sermon Writer Assistant** may not be able to process them all.
10. Use simple language and avoid using too many technical terms.
11. Keep conversations short and to the point.
12. Use appropriate punctuation and capitalization when conversing with **Sermon Writer Assistant**.
12. Provide positive feedback when **Sermon Writer Assistant** does something correctly to encourage it to learn.

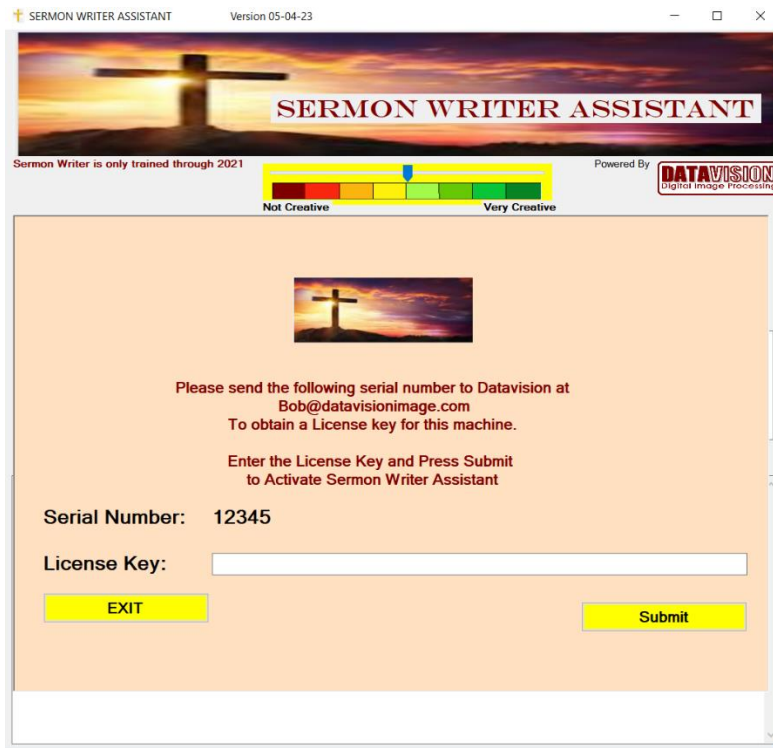
Installing Sermon Writer Assistant

1. Unzip the download file.
2. Click on Setup.exe.
3. The program will install on your computer and add an ICON to your desktop.
4. Sermon Writer Assistant has a FREE five day trial period for you to test the program to be sure it is right for you.
5. After 5 days you will get this screen:



6. Copy the Serial Number shown on the screen and email this number to bob@datavisionimage.com
7. We will send you a link to pay the license fee of \$100.00. Once paid, we will mail you the license key.

8. Type in the License Key in the above License Key text box and press "Submit".
9. Sermon Writer Assistant will now operate as normal for as long as you want to use it.
